

## **Brazil Climate Action Hub exhibits multi-award-winning movie *The Territory* at COP27**

With the recent election of Lula as President of Brazil, the question of the Amazon Forest's future is suddenly infused with hope.

Speaking into this most urgent climate issue is multi-award-winning National Geographic Documentary film "**The Territory**", a dynamic co-creation between director Alex Pritz and the Indigenous Uru-eu-wau-wau community in Brazil. With striking images and a powerfully immersive soundscape, this incredible new film shows the devastation the Indigenous community faces as their land and people come progressively under attack by farmers and loggers.

Please join us on **Thursday 10th November, from 6.30pm to 8.30pm (Egypt time)**, when the Brazil Action Hub will screen a never-before-seen 30-minute cut of the film and host a discussion with Indigenous activists Neidinha Bandeira and Txai Suruí (who is also an Executive Producer of "The Territory").

Txai and Neidinha will share first-hand their experiences fighting on the front lines of deforestation and address the impact of deforestation on Indigenous communities in Brazil. They will also be sharing their hopes and concerns arising from Lula's return to Brazil's presidency and how the international community can play a vital role in strengthening protections for Indigenous communities as they continue to defend their territory and protect the planet for us all.

The event will conclude with networking drinks, giving attendees an opportunity to speak informally with Txai and Neidinha. The Territory will also be screened in full at CultureCOP in the Seyal Desert Hub on Sunday 13th November, where Txai will be joined by Priscila Tapajowara, an Indigenous activist, climate activist, photographer, producer of audiovisual content and co-coordinator of Mídia Índia.
